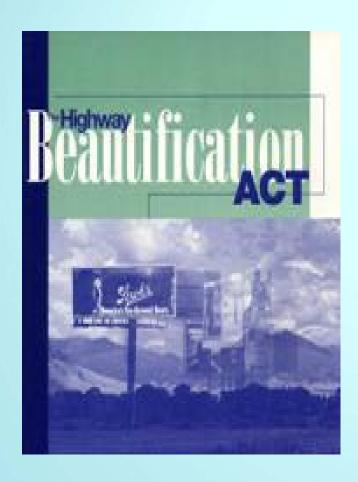
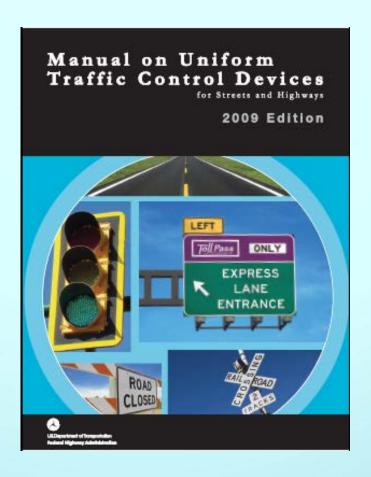

Why do we regulate signs?

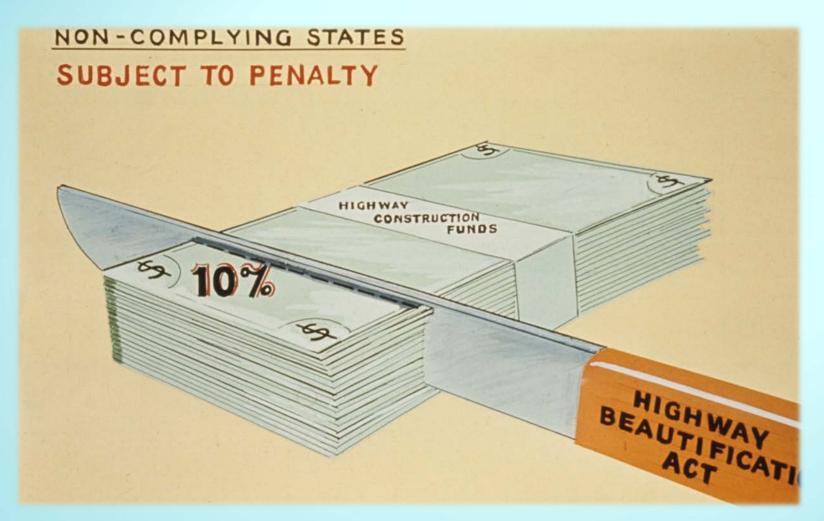


Reduce sign clutter. Protect views. Reduce distraction and confusion.

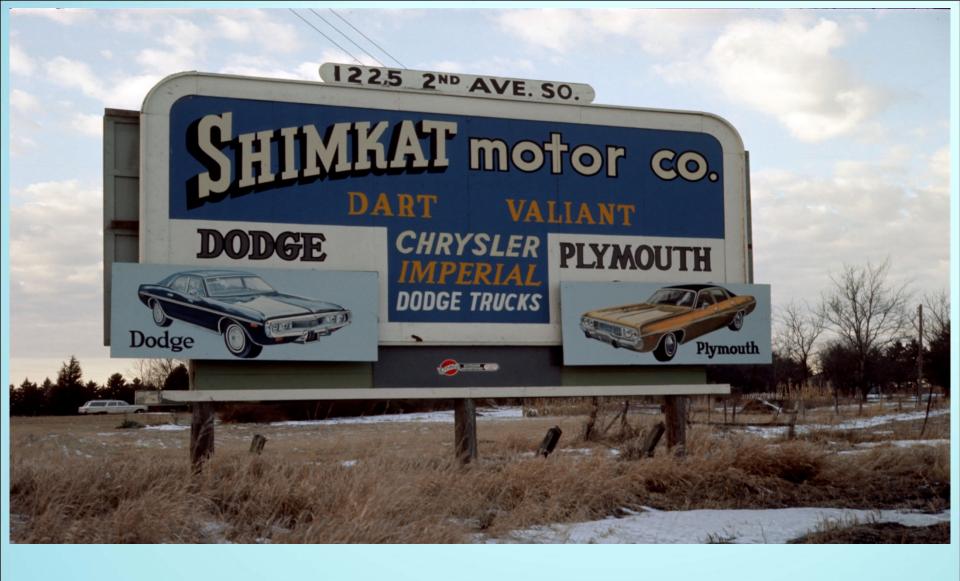




Federal Regulations



Annual Federal Aid Highway Funds can be reduced for States that do not comply



lowa was cited for noncompliance in 1971



lowa legislature passes billboard control law: 1972

- Avoided the ten percent penalty
- Controlled off-premise signs
- Controlled junkyards



On-Premise vs. Off-Premise



On-premise signs advertise goods, services, or activities taking place on the same property as the sign. NO PERMIT REQUIRED.

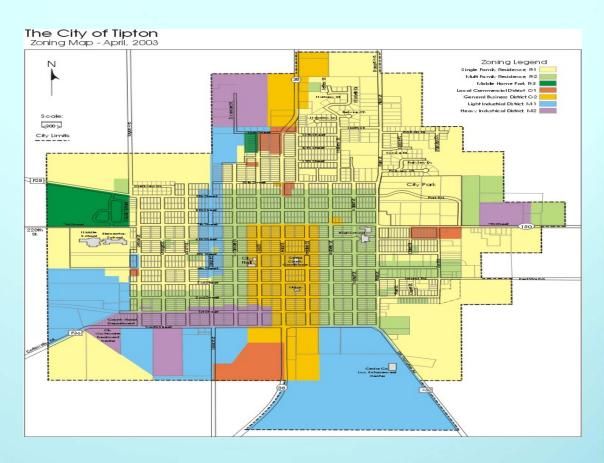


Off-Premise signs advertise activities, goods or services available on a different property. PERMIT IS REQUIRED.

Permits cannot be issued for any locations on public right-of-way



Permits can only be issued in areas zoned commercial or industrial





Spacing:

- 100' in city non-freeway
- 300' in rural non-freeway
- 250' in city freeway
- 500' in rural freeway



Permits cannot be issued along scenic byways.



Size limit = 1200 sq. ft. single face; 750 sq. ft. for stacked, side-by-side or back-to-back units.

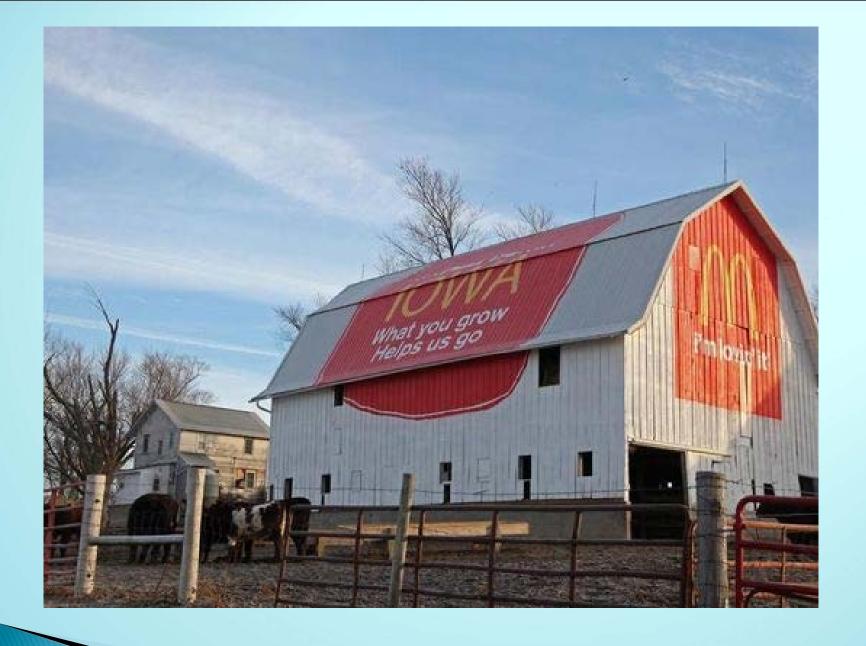


Permit plates are issued by the DOT and must be displayed on the sign

Are these "signs" that can be regulated?





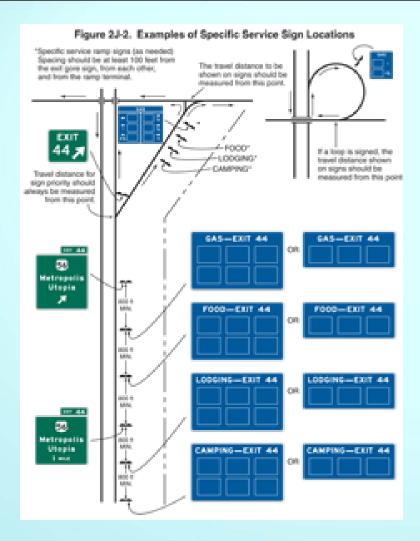






Logo Signing





For Interchanges Only -Typically Four Logo Signs Used

Fees: \$230/sign/year Business pays to produce signs Signs are BIG! 5' x 3'



Categories









Limitations:

DOT must have adequate space to place the signs. Signs can only hold six logos.

Total number of service signs cannot exceed 4. Qualifying requirements exist for businesses.



Political Campaign Signs

- Allowed any time of year
- No size limit
- No permit needed
- Must be on private property
- Permission by property owner
- Stay 300' back of voting sites

Official City Signs Official County Signs



Authorized by the City of Readlyn as "official".

- -No advertising permitted
- -Must not be on the ROW



Authorized as "official" by Jones County.

- -No advertising permitted
- -Must not be on ROW.

Church Signs

8 sq. ft. Stay off ROW



Tourist-Oriented Directional Signs (TODS)



Restrictions:

- At-grade intersections only
- Rural areas (pop. 5000 max) only

Categories:

- Motorist Services (Gas Station, Restaurant, Motel)
- Tourist Attractions (Grotto, Museum, Freedom Rock)
- Ag Activity (Winery, Pumpkin Patch, Hog Farm w/tours)
- Commercial (antique shop, local crafts, gift shop)

Committee - Ten Members

- D.O.T. Advertising Manager
- D.O.T. State Traffic Engineer
- Iowa Economic Development Authority
- D.N.R.
- Dept. of Agriculture
- State Historical Society
- Outdoor Advertising Association
- One private business member from each lowa tourism region

Fee: \$700/set of two "mainlines" Trailblazers (if needed) - \$26/sign



Private Directional





Size Limit: 150 sq. ft.

Fee: \$100 app. \$15/year

Location: Cannot be near exit ramps or parks

Approval: Committee

- Natural phenomena (Spook Cave)
- Historic (U.P. Railroad Museum)
- Cultural (Danish Windmill)
- Scientific (Life Engineering Foundation)
- Educational (lowa Arboretum)
- Religious (West Bend Grotto)
- Outdoor Rec (Lost Island Waterpark)

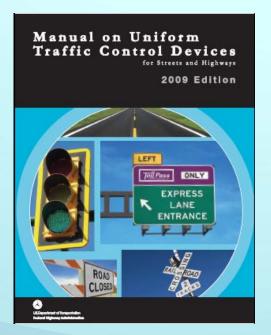
B - Destination Guide Signs for Color-Coded Community Wayfinding System

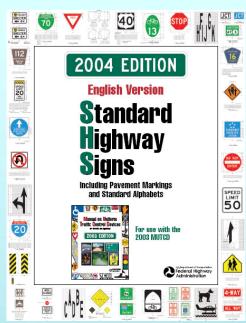




Signs on the State Highways are handled by DOT and must comply with MUTCD and SHS

Signs on the local system *should* conform to MUTCD and SHS – Contact DOT for advice





Purpose:

Guide visitors through a consistent color-coded system of signs that give directional information to key civic, cultural, visitor, and recreational destinations within the community







The "Cap" portion:

- Should not be larger than the guide sign
- May use color-coding & pictograph
- Must be retroreflective
- Should be consistent with overall signing plan
- Should be identified at entrance points

The Guide Sign portion:

- Must be rectangular
- Must be retroreflective
- Must not contain advertising
- Does not have to be white on green but avoid red,

orange, yellow and purple.

Limit # Destinations to 3



Sign Replacement Program for Towns

- Replace existing worn-out MUTCD-type signs
- Up to \$5000 per town
- Posts & hardware available
- First-come, first-serve basis
- Does not apply to NEW signs
- No stockpiling for future use
